Then she worked for UNDP as the manager for the regional project Prompting Women's Rights and Legal Empowerment, UNDP/Kuwait (November 2011- October 2013). Where she established the regional project (Wracati), which is the first of its kind on the Gulf region. Then she appointed as the first Arabic speaking Senior Women Protection Advisor to join the team of the Secretary General Representative to combat sexual violence in conflict (SRSG/SVC).
